An Act to provide for the preservation of wild birds.

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection Act 1937.

2 Commencement

This Act shall have force and effect as on and from 30 November 1937.

3 Repeal

The Wild Birds Preservation Ordinance (No 12 of 1924) and the Wild Birds Preservation Ordinance 1936 are hereby repealed.

4 Interpretation

In this Act:

'close season' means in respect to any bird specified in Schedule 1 the period set opposite the name of the bird in that Schedule.

5 Restriction on taking certain species of bird at any time

A person who without permission of the Minister takes any bird specified in Schedule 2, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$10.

6 Restriction on taking certain species of bird during close season

A person who:

- (a) knowingly and wilfully destroys, takes, causes to be destroyed, or taken;
- (b) uses any lime, trap, snare, net or other instrument for the purpose of destroying or taking; or
- (c) has in his or her possession, any bird specified in Schedule 1 during the period of close season set opposite the name or the bird,

shall be liable on the first conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$2 and on a subsequent conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$10 or imprisonment not exceeding 14 days or to both.

7 Restriction on taking, etc, of eggs

A person who takes or destroys, or has in his or her possession, any eggs of the birds specified in Schedule 1 during the period of close season set opposite the name of the birds shall be liable on the first conviction to a penalty not

exceeding \$2 and on a subsequent conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$10 or imprisonment not exceeding 14 days or to both.
