MENTALLY-DISORDERED PERSONS (AMENDMENT) BILL 2020

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Mentally-disordered Persons (Amendment) Bill 2020 is a for the Mentally-disordered Persons (Amendment) Act 2020.

This memorandum provides an explanation of the Bill and is only intended to indicate the general effect.

EXPLANATION OF CLAUSES

Clause 1 provides that, once enacted, the short title of the Bill will be the *Mentallydisordered Persons (Amendment) Act 2020.*

Clause 2 sets out when the Bill's provisions will commence which is upon certification by the Speaker.

Clause 3 is the enabling provision for the amendment of the *Mentally-disordered Persons* Act 1963.

Clause 4 amends Section 1 of the Act by amending the short title from '*Mentally-disordered Persons Act 1963*' to '*Mental Health Act 1963*'. The change to the name of the Act ensures the Republic keeps up with the evolving landscape of mental health care and the terminology used.

Clause 5 is the general amendment clause which removes the following words from being used: 'mental disorder', 'mentally-disordered' and 'mentally disordered'.

The Act will instead use terms such as 'mentally impaired' or 'mental impairment' in place of 'mental disorder', 'mentally-disordered' and 'mentally disordered', which are more palatable.
