MOTOR TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) BILL 2016

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Motor Traffic (Amendment) Bill is a Bill for the Motor Traffic (Amendment) Act 2016.

EXPLANATION OF CLAUSES

Clause 1 provides that, once enacted, the short title of the Bill will be the Motor Traffic (*Amendment*) *Act 2016.*

Clause 2 sets out when the Bill's provisions will commence.

Clause 3 is the enabling provisions for the amendment of the *Motor Traffic Act 2014.*

Clause 4 amends section 57 (1) by omitting the words 'with an engine of a 100 cc or greater', thus making it mandatory to wear helmets when driving or riding on a motorcycle in Nauru.

Clause 5 inserts a section 67A that deals with dangerous driving occasioning death and sets a penalty of 10 years imprisonment upon conviction.

Clause 6 inserts a section 67B that deals with dangerous driving occasioning grievous bodily harm and sets a penalty of 7 years imprisonment upon conviction.

Clause 7 repeals section 69.

Clause 8 inserts a new section 69 that gives power to a police officer to order a vehicle off the road and arrest a person whom the officer believes is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or of a drug without warrant.

Clause 9 inserts a section 75A providing police with other forms of determining intoxication of person if no prescribed instrument is available.

Clause 10 amends section 79(1) by omitting the words "subsection (2) of".

Clause 11 amends section 81(2) by omitting "69".
