NAURU LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCIL ORDINANCE 1951-1967ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS

It is notified for general information that a poll was taken on 16th March 1968 to elect Councillors for all electoral districts, except the districts of Aiwo and Boe. In Aiwo, Samuel Edwin Tsitsi was elected unopposed and in Boe, Hammer DeRoburt was elected unopposed.
